Approval of work experience and number of credits to be earned is required. Course may be repeated for a total of six hours with instructor approval. Required writing assignments.

II. Student Learning Outcomes

A. Subject Matter

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will:

- 1. Demonstrate and explain specific work skills learned through the internship experience.
- 2. Identify and describe specific work related traits necessary for successful employment with the agency.
- 3. Explain the assigned agency's history and mission.
- 4. Reflect on and describe what they learned through the internship experience.
- 5. Identify concepts found in the work environment and relate them to principles, concepts or ideals found in their criminal justice course work.
- 6. Develop a journal of their daily experiences and write a descriptive report outlining their experience with the agency.
- 7. Use technology to present ideas, concepts, findings and recommendations.

B. University Learning Outcomes

This course enhances student abilities in the following areas:

Analytical Skills

Critical Thinking Skills: Students will use critical thinking skills to identify problems/issues and develop solutions/analysis.

Communication Skills (written and oral)

Students will communicate proficiently. Students will use essay format for written presentation of research projects and discuss particular aspects of various topics in a seminar setting.
