Further instruction in developing intermediate level keyboard skills, which includes scales, arpeggios, and chord patterns and inversions in all major and minor keys; harmonization and improvisation of melodies and chord patterns; and performance of a prepared intermediate level piano composition.

- 1. Play I-IV-V-I patterns in major and minor keys using root position chords and their inversions
- 2. Play I-vi-ii-V-I and I-IV-V/V-V-I patterns in all major keys using root position chords
- 3. Play all major and minor scales (hands together), 2 octaves
- 4. Play all major and minor arpeggios (hands together), 2 octaves
- 5. Sight read a simple hymn
- 6. Harmonize and improvise melodies
- 7. Play accompaniments (using root position triads and inversions) to vocal melodies
- 8. Perform an intermediate level solo piano composition.
