Upper-level studio courses: select 15 hours from any 3000 or 4000 level ART courses, GRDS 3223, and GRDS 2262
- 4. World language requirement: eight hours. Must complete through Beginning II of a world language.
- 5. Additional degree requirement, 20 hours. 12 must be upper level. A minor is required; follow the respective minor requirements. Consult with faculty advisor.
- 6. Students are strongly recommended to take AHIS 2863 before AHIS 2873.
- 7. Prior to graduation students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FIN 1521 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of C or better, or by a score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FIN 1521.
